AN EC			gen	<p>The document clearly shows that TG2 have carried out a great deal of work to research and compile it. However we have a number of detailed comments and some major concerns. The first concern regards the exclusion of barriers in certain areas and the second the lack of cost/benefit analysis and the impact of increased accessibility on industry, as requested by M/473. Thirdly, as the activity aims to cut across other areas/standards and ensure that they consider accessibility, it is essential to have an effective mechanism for this.</p> <p>The document also feels slightly 'out of date' in terms of technology as recent technology developments are not reflected in the report. The following items are missing:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - mobile or tablet devices, either as an entity or as a means by which consumers access the various technologies discussed. - epayments, mpayments, NFC/RFID (new ways of paying such as Apple pay/ Samsung Pay and Paypal) - Internet of things; connected homes; smart objects - Wearable devices and new interfaces - Mhealth / ehealth applications
