SAMNIC MOOC

SAMNIC is a transnational project, funded under the EU Erasmus+ Programme, to develop and implement a MOOC – a Massive Open Online Course – on the Safety Assessment and Management for New and Innovative Children's Products. The MOOC is targeted principally at industry (especially SMEs) and consumer organisations.

SAMNIC MOOC is an online free Internet course to which almost everyone can register; it has practically an unlimited number of participants.

The SAMNIC MOOC is expected to be ready in August 2016 and will be available in English, Spanish, French, Italian, Czech and Portuguese. It will be accessible through PCs, tablets and smartphones.






>>Fourth meeting of project SAMNIC
